Vamsi: Once, I happened to download a standard and started working on preparing something rush and referencing it. The next day, I received an email from Techstreet alerting me that the standard I downloaded previously was updated to a new revision. It made me pause for a second and think, "How grateful is it to get alerted of something like this which is significant to the work I was performing! Else, I had to redo that document." So, the favorite part here is working with Techstreet itself, undoubtedly!

Techstreet: How important are alerts and updates to your standards management platform? Can you provide an example of how you use this information?

Vamsi: Techstreet is like a sea of standards and codes. The most unique aspect I like about it is its update notification feature. I like how we get notified about changes/updates in the versions of the code, so we are kept aware. Being an admin in our QA department, I often do get requests from people regarding difficulties accessing a document and I do my due diligence in making sure that they are trying to access the latest version of the document and a simple glance into the updates or alerts will give me that information, which I can confidently relay to others.

Techstreet: What's your best #SuperUser tip for other Techstreet Enterprise users out there?

Vamsi: Of the various useful features offered by Techstreet, one feature I like is the code redline option. The first feature you would want to know after getting onto Techstreet is this redline feature which makes it simple to understand the changes that were made to the previous versions.
